

Report on activities carried out by the UG
Plenipotentiary for Open Access to Scientific
Publications and Research Results in 2021



By implementing the Open Access Policy approved by the Senate of the University of Gdańsk on 14<sup>th</sup> of December 2017 (62/17), the following activities were carried out throughout 2020 in specific areas:

#### ----- UG Knowledge Base/Repository/UG Scientific Journals Platform

- 1. Modification of the UG Knowledge Base for the evaluation of scientific achievements and employee evaluation (new functionalities, extended reporting).
- 2. UG Scientific Journals Platform which enables journals to publish their articles in open access improved functionality (https://czasopisma.bg.ug.edu.pl/).
- 3. Submission of another 21 applications under the Ministry of Science and Higher Education (MEIN) program "Development of scientific journals".
- 4. Implementation of OA publishing support programs co-financing of publication costs by MEiN for selected publishers:

Springer – 40 approved, 37 published, grant amount: EUR 93,400

Elsevier – 32 approved and published, total discounts granted: USD 12,064.09

IOAP MDPI – 288 applications, 212 published, total discounts granted: CHF 194,493.06

ACS – 8 articles, total cost of articles: USD 32,000 (half co-financed by MEiN)

IOP – 1 article, cost of the article: GPB 2,070 (half co-financed by MEiN)

Emerald – 1 article (no information on the grant amount)

#### ----- Legal acts

1. Regulation No. 3/R/21 of the Rector of the University of Gdańsk of 7 January 2021 on the fund for co-financing the dissemination of scientific research results - "UG Publication Program".

The UG Publication Program is a system of support for the publication development of academic teachers and students of doctoral schools of the University of Gdańsk, under which you can obtain funding for the costs of publishing in prestigious journals and scientific publications, as well as the costs of publishing in open access. The main goal of the program is to improve the quality of scientific research and increase the recognition of our university in the world.

2. Regulation No. 46/R/21 of the Rector of the University of Gdańsk of 18 March 2021 on the creation of the "UG Scientific Journals Development Program" fund at the University of Gdańsk. The aim of the Program is to support the development of journals published by units of the University of Gdańsk, in particular their international recognition.



#### ----- Activities under the Publication Program

The program was implemented in 2021 according to the modified rules. In total, 127 applications for co-financing the costs of open access to scientific publications were submitted, 106 of which received co-financing for the total amount of **PLN 532,292.83**.

### ----- Implementation of the BRIDGE OF DATA project




#### ---- Trainings, workshops, conferences








----- Share of OA articles in relation to the total number of articles affiliated to UG in the two largest Journal Databases


